Birds'eye Primrose is not found widely in Britain. It has one main location in the AONB around the banks of Haweswater and a smaller colony at Warton Quarry.

Historical records show it was found many years ago around the boggy areas by Hazelslack and towards Arnside Moss. However none have been found there lately eeven though we did look. As well as being rare itself it is host to one of our very rare smuts, Urocystis primulicola (above right). Luckily this only affects a proprtion of the seed cases so doesn't damage the host population
